

Sunday Worship

September Worship on Sundays at CPC


**Kids Need clothes?** Yes, Kellond Elementary school discovered a family in dire need of back to school help. Our Mission Planning Team jumped into action and was able to purchase a bunch of back to school clothes and supplies for this family. Our ongoing giving to the general fund of CPC, along with some extra giving to the designated mission fund made this possible. The need was met within a few days. So, thank you, CPC, you are clothing those in need.

**Food is pouring in!** Many CPC'ers have been donating food for our Haven Totes program where we give a weekend bag of extra food to 31 kids at Kellond Elementary School. It costs us about \$150 per child to make this program work during a school year, and some have been adding \$150 to their giving to make sure children can be a part of this great mission project! Thank you, CPC, your giving is taking care of children.

**400 sandwiches?** That's twice what we used to do! Right. Each month, we are providing 400 sandwiches (in 200 lunches) to the Casa Maria Soup Kitchen to help people in need in Tucson. One of our CPC family members is donating the wonderful bread rolls for the lunches. Together, we are buying the meats, cheeses, zip bags, fruit, cookies, and lunch sacks. Thank you CPC. Your generosity is feeding people in need.

Amazing what we do together to honor and glorify God. Praise be to the Lord!

#### First Light: Jesus and the Kingdom

## **A Few Flea Market Facts**



**Fact #1** : The need for volunteers to help with pricing, sorting, boxing, storing, picking up donations never ends. The minute one Flea Market ends, we begin collecting for the following year. Donations begin filling our closets and storage units right away. That is great news, of course, as it is the very reason this fundraiser continues to be hugely successful. On the flip side, few volunteers are available to help support this fundraising effort...especially from April through Jan.

**Fact #2**: All volunteers are rewarded with 20% coupons, and fed each Secondhand Weekend when we meet to clear out the accumulation of items collected from the previous month. All volunteers are entitled to one – 20% Coupon. This coupon is good for any ONE PURCHASE. That purchase may include any number of items (no limit). Purchases can be make throughout the year by those who volunteer. Those of us on the Flea Market Team take turns bringing in food for all who volunteer. Breakfast snacks and lunch foods are provided by us. Not everything is a full-fledged meal, but volunteers don't go hungry. Anyone wishing to help by providing some of the meals...we won't say no.

**Fact #3**: While sorting through cast-offs by others may not sound like a good time, it surprisingly is. For 'treasure hunters', the donation stack is like a mountain of gold, just waiting to be mined! And the comradery and bonds that are formed in the process, are even more precious. You'll get to know/share stories/laugh with people that you would otherwise not meet as they may go to a different service, or sit on the other side of the room during your service.
